Championship Round up



U21 C Football West Cork Champions 2014

The **U21 C footballers** met St James in the final played in Ballinscarthy. Inspired by captain Declan Harrington, Kilbrittain led at halftime 1-6 to 0-2 and while St James fought hard in the second half, Kilbrittain put in a fine display to win the competition for the first time.

The **Premier Intermediate hurlers** went under to a hungrier Newcestown in a wet Bandon in the 1st round. The 2nd round saw a 2nd half collapse as Valley Rovers took total control following a 1-7 each h/time scoreline. It was hard to say what happened, the loss of Jamie Wall shortly before the game didn't help but put the result into



perspective. A third rd meeting with Kilworth saw Kilworth outscored Kilbrittain 9 points to 1 in the final quarter to send Kilbrittain into a relegation play-off where they met Watergrasshill. Both sides had met in the quarter-final in 2013. Following one of our better performances of the year, Wtaergrasshill prevailed by five points. Kilbrittain now enter the Intermediate grade for 2015.

The **Junior A footballers** pushed champions St Colums all the way to the wire and almost pulled off the shock of the championship. St Colums won by a point. In The 2nd round St Marys outplayed Kilbrittain in Newcestown winning by 6 points. The relegation play-off versus Dohenys has been fixed for 28th September. The loser is relegated. The winner must then play Ilen Rovers, with the loser of that also being relegated.

The **Junior A hurlers** met O'Donovan Rossa in the 1^{st} round. Hitting 1-2 in the first 6 minutes, the Skibb side never looked back and won comfortably. In the 2^{nd} round, Kilbrittain fashioned a great 2^{nd} half comeback to win a cracker by 2 points. In the quarter-final an early Dohenys goal proved the main difference in a tight game which they won by 4 points.

The **Junior B hurlers** found themselves out of their depth in a one sided 1^{st} round against Carbery Rangers.

The **U21 B hurlers** had a good 1st round win over Diarmuid O'Mathunas. They met a strong Clonakilty side in the semi-final and following a hugely entertaining game, Clon emerged victorius by 5 points.

Carbery:

Well done to Josh O'Donovan, Patrick O'Mahony, Ian Hodge, Dylan Twohig, and Darragh Moore and Fergal Keohane (mentor), who were involved with Carbery minor hurlers. Having beaten Blackrock, St Colmans, Charleville and Courcey Rovers to reach the Premier 2 final against Aghabullough. Carbery made history winning the title for the first time on a 4-17 to 1-16 scoreline.



The **minor C hurlers** beat Carbery Rangers and Bantry to reach the West Cork final where they met St James. A high scoring game saw St James do the damage in the 1^{st} half. Kilbrittain put in a fine 2^{nd} half but fell short in a very entertaining contest. St James won 5-12 to 3-11.

In the *minor C football* C'ship, Kilbrittain had a great win over St Colums, and beat Urhan in the quarter-final after a replay.

The **U16 A hurlers** were beaten by Clonakilty 3-12 to 1-3 in Rd2 and were beaten by Ahane Gaels 3-13 to 1-10 in rd 3.

The **U14 B hurlers** were well beaten in a quarter-final by Kilbree.

The **U14 C footballers** were also well beaten by Tadgh McCarthaigh in the semi-final.
